Investigating a Slave Quarter using archaeology and Historical Inquiry

Join us for the first ever joint Georgia-Florida Project Archaeology teacher training workshop on Cumberland Island! The workshop aims to familiarize educators with archaeology resources for the classroom that can enhance learning opportunities in math, science, art, and social studies.

Workshop participants will receive two archaeology education guides published by *Project Archaeology*.

- *Intrigue of the Past* is a teacher activity guide that addresses basic scientific and archaeological principles as well as exploring specific studies and ethical issues.
- *Investigating Shelter: A Poplar Slave Quarter* is a 4th and 5th grade curriculum guide that takes students through an archaeological investigation, including accounts from oral history, use of primary documents, and interpreting the archaeological record.

Participants will meet on the St. Mary's Waterfront on Saturday May 22, 2010 at 8:00. Transportation to the island will provided by National Park Service. Lodging in the dorms will also be provided for one night in dorm style housing. Plan for your own lunches and snacks, a community dinner will be provided. Most the activities will be indoors, but be prepared for outdoor walking tours of some of the ruins.
